

**FOOD & BEVERAGE COMMITTEE MEETING**  
**MAY 9, 2006**  
**7:00 P.M.**

ATTENDANCE: Lamond Martin, Sean Cassiday, Mike Goodin, Diana Boose, Phyllis Carr

Lamond called the meeting to order.

First item of discussion was the purchase of the Pine Box Theatre property. Question on whether an offer had been made and what the status was? Lamond had stated since he had not attending the Town Council meeting in April, this item had been tabled for discussion. Phyllis advised the Committee, the Town Attorney suggests they hold a public meeting in regards to the placement of the restrooms in this area. Committee members feel this is an opportune place for the new restrooms and feel the public would benefit from this. It would utilize this side of town. Question if no restrooms were erected in this area, would it be feasible to put a public parking lot there? Diana feels we are loosing more parking every year and this would help bring back some of what we have lost. More discussion on this topic at the next meeting in June. Will have more input from the Town Council. Phyllis advised she was having parking inventoried. This will help in determining what areas need to be upgraded. All information, once compiled will be forwarded to the Parking Committee for their records.

Phyllis advised the Committee of the Skate Park information that was emailed/mailed to her. The information enclosed was for filing for a grant if we were interested in proceeding with this. Information was given to the Town Council for their input and Roger Bush, Acting Town Superintendent advised the Food & Beverage Commission may be interested in this project. After a small discussion, members advised to forward this information to the Parks & Rec. office. Phyllis advised she would do so.

Discussion on the reply letter from the Brown County School Board in regards to the bus lot enforcement issue. The letter we received from the school board (see attached) states they don't feel it would be in the best interest of the School Corporation to authorize any type of enforcement. Also, due to the size of the bus lot, they don't feel they could offer any more spaces for additional motor coaches. The School Board did approve to extend the terms of the agreement between them and the Town of Nashville.

Discussion on more patrol at the Old School Way restrooms. Phyllis advised the members that she had made a request to the Town Marshal regarding this matter. Suggestions were made to help prevent any vandalism to the parking lot or the restrooms. Installing a fake camera was one suggestion. This would help prevent kids from going in the restrooms and vandalizing them. Phyllis has received complaints of school kids unlocking the closure, parking and relocking the rope. Most complaints received are from merchants. It was suggested to place a chain with a padlock to prevent anyone undoing the lock. Another suggestion was to mark the tires of vehicles in the lot, to determine the length of time the vehicle was parked there. Members feel if the new parking lot went through, it would give an additional 20-25 parking spaces which could be utilized by the school kids, since a lot of kids park on west Washington street. This topic will need further discussion once the Pine Box Theatre property decision is made.

Minutes from the last meeting were reviewed & approved. With nothing further to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
