THEREFORE, we will work with our town, country and others all around the world to enhance the earth with trees, to continue to educate, to help people realize the gift trees can be in our lives.



THEREFORE, we the Arbor Day Committee with the Town Council of Nashville claim Arbor Day in Nashville, Indiana as November 6, 2010.






