

RESOLUTION 2011-01
OF THE TOWN OF NASHVILLE, INDIANA
REGARDING THE NASHVILLE FOOD AND BEVERAGE TAX

WHEREAS, the current Food and Beverage Tax is critical to Nashville's economy by providing funding for public parking and public restroom facilities to support its tourism industry and;


WHEREAS, this tax is used by the Town of Nashville solely to finance, construct, improve, equip, operate, and maintain public parking and public restroom facilities and;

WHEREAS, the current tax will sunset January 1, 2012 and;

WHEREAS, without the tax revenues of the Food and Beverage Tax, Nashville will be unable to continue providing those services funded by the current tax:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Nashville, Brown County, Indiana requests that its State Legislative Delegation seek an extension of the sunset provisions of the current tax.






Charles B. King, Council Vice-President yea nay abstain


