KEY TO THE VILLAGE AWARD

COMMITTEE MEETING

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 2009

COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT – Councilmember Robert Kirlin,

The Committee meeting began at 3:00 pm.

The Committee discussed the creation of a Village Key and the criteria in which to award the keys. Councilmember Kirlin had presented a sample key made out of glass from the Lawrence Family Glass Blowers. The Lawrence Family has offered to donate the awards to the Town with a limit of five per year. Councilmember Kirlin will work on getting a proto type wood base to set the glass key upon. The wood base will have a small brass plaque with the recipients name and the award title on it. The Committee discussed having a master key plaque at Town Hall to have each award recipients name inscribed on a name plate.

The Committee decided that the awards will be presented to someone who has given of themselves selflessly beyond the call of duty to the Village of Nashville. The nominations will be made by the Awards Committee that shall consist of two Councilmembers and one member at large (must be a resident of the town of Nashville and appointed by the Nashville Town Council in January of each year). The annual awards will be given as warranted and will be limited up to five per year. The award recipients do not have to be residents of the Town of Nashville. Of the five possible awards per year, one award will be given posthumous if needed. The awards will be presented by the Town Council at a Council meeting.


The Village Key Committee's suggestions will be discussed at an upcoming Council meeting.
