# **COMMISSION BUSINESS**

### 1) CALL TO ORDER

President Voland called the meeting to order at 10:04 am.

Member Martin asked that a "the" in front of "Pat Reilly" be removed. Member Hopkins moved to approve the 4-14-2022 meeting minutes with the amendment. Member Walters seconded the motion. All were unanimously in favor.

## 4) COMMITTEE REPORTS

# A. Public & Performing Arts

Member McCann agreed to temporarily chair this committee because Member Schmidt resigned after the last meeting. Member McCann wants to install signage for Dancers and High Lonesome but needs information on the artists and when they were initially installed.

Regarding the INDOT vinyl project, Member Bennett reported that Bob Blass sent emails to the artists and the sign company. President Voland wants something listed in the BC Democrat Arts Brief regarding the finalists. Member Bennett agreed and will work on drafting a detailed article.

President Voland mentioned that a review of the funds received for arts education should be conducted by June. A mural project could be done with local students this fall.

#### B. Outreach & Education - Chair Anabel Hopkins

Vice-President Hopkins reported that the Story Wine Fair sold 1,000 tickets. She had the first booth, which was visible to attendees as they entered. M.K. Watkins helped to hand out the 4th Friday Art Walk brochures. The artists did not sell much, but there was good visibility and a successful event overall. President Voland asked Vice-President Hopkins to attend the Fingerstyle Competition and do the same. Vice-President Hopkins also reported that the Art Walk is going well this season, with participating galleries doing more promotion. The music at the Playhouse is a great addition as well.

#### C. Marie in the Woods Dedication - Chair Melanie Voland

President Voland will order a couple of floral arrangements for the event. She will get a quote and submit it to the Clerk-Treasurer's Office soon. Member Martin and Ellen Rigley Carter will say a few words about Marie Goth's influence on the community. President Voland advised that Member Wilson is working on the project and is moving forward with QR codes on the leaves.

Vice-President Hopkins reminded everyone that the committee needs to identify a new member on the Commission who can take the recently vacated spot by Member Schmidt.
