## NASHVILLE TOWN ORDINANCE NO. 2005-13

WHEREAS, the increasing population of deer and other large wild animals in residential areas may be injurious to property and creates a safety hazard for vehicular traffic; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council believes that the deer and other large wild animals create a danger to the public safety in residential areas while realizing that they are part of a wild and protected population which cannot be controlled.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDAINED that it shall be unlawful to bait deer or other large wild animals with salt, mineral blocks or other attractants within the limits of the Town of Nashville. It is further ordained that any person who violates this ordinance shall be fined upon conviction thereof any sum of money not exceeding Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00). It is further ordained that each time a person continues to feed or bait deer or other large wild animals in violation of this ordinance after said person has been notified to cease and desist by the Town Marshal, Town Manager or other town staff, shall be deemed a separate violation subject to separate fine.

(This Ordinance shall be codified in Chapter 90 of the Code of Ordinances at Section 90.09)
