A PROCLAMATION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF NASHVILLE, INDIANA, HONORING THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS ON THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THEIR FOUNDING

WHEREAS, the Women's Suffrage Movement was organized in 1848 at the Seneca Falls Convention in New York State and over the next 72 years, many women dedicated their very lives to the cause; and

WHEREAS, on June 4th, 1919, the assembled Congress of the United States of America passed the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, prohibiting states and the federal government from denying the right to vote to citizens of the United States on the basis of sex, and submitted it to the states for ratification; and

WHEREAS, the 19th Amendment to the Constitution was ratified by the last of the necessary thirty-six states on August 18th, 1920 and was officially adopted on August 26th in the year 1920; and

WHEREAS, the National League of Women Voters was organized on February 14th, 1920 to educate and engage these newly enfranchised women; and

WHEREAS, in the past 100 years, through the actions of and with the support of the League of Women Voters, women have made significant contributions to government and the real-life issues affected by government; and

WHEREAS, the League of Women Voters has promoted participation by informed citizens at all levels of government and has helped shape public policy, and

WHEREAS, the League of Women Voters of Brown County, impacts local as well as national issues.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town of Nashville, Indiana salutes the League of Women Voters on their 100th anniversary as a League and the League of Women Voters of Brown County on their 47th anniversary.
