COMMISSION BUSINESS

1) CALL TO ORDER

5) UPDATE ON FUND RAISING IDEAS

President Gredy presented a brick and tile sample that could be used as a fund-raising idea. Both the tile and brick were engraved to show exactly how they would look if the Commission would like to proceed with this idea for a fund-raiser. President Gredy called Kim Fields owner Bricks R Us during the meeting and Kim answered the questions the Commission had.

There is no price difference between the laser or sand blasting. Laser is easier to clean and you cannot pressure wash the sand blasted bricks or tiles. Four lines with 21 characters per line would cost \$5.00 for printing and \$19.00 per brick with free shipping and a lifetime guarantee on the text.

6) ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Shari Frank was present to discuss the 2023 Pollinator Fest taking place on Saturday July 22, 2023 at 12:30 to 3:30 pm at the Brown County 4H Fair Grounds Exhibit Hall & Pavilion. Discussion of areas in Town that could be turned into a pollinator garden. Lincoln Pinch Park or possibly at the four corners. Member Cressey feels a downtown area would be better, since there
