

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-01

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TOWN
BUSINESS LICENSE APPLICATION PROCEDURE**

WHEREAS, the Town of Nashville has an established procedure for issuing licenses to conduct business within the Town Limits; and

WHEREAS, the license application procedure has heretofore required the applicant to furnish a photostatic copy of a valid State Retail Merchants Certificate before the Clerk-Treasurer can issue a Business License and this procedure has, in the past, caused delays in the application for, and the issuance, of licenses for certain businesses.


THE NASHVILLE TOWN COUNCIL, THEREFORE, ORDAINS as follows:

Section 110.03 of the Town Code of Ordinances be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

- A. Before issuing a license each business shall file with the Clerk-Treasurer an application on forms provided by the Town.
- B. The fee for each business license shall be Thirty Dollars, (\$30.00).
- C. Any person, organization, group, or association acquiring a business license shall apply for and pay for the same no later than Three, (3) business days before the 1st date of commencing business in any calendar year.
- D. Each license shall be for the calendar year of issue.


This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and replaces and repeals Ordinance 1984-3 and Amended Ordinance 1989-6 and shall be codified as Section 110.03 in the Nashville Code of Ordinances.
