**WHEREAS**, this tax is used by the Town of Nashville solely to finance, construct, improve, equip, operate, and maintain public parking and public restroom facilities and;


**WHEREAS**, the current tax will sunset January 1, 2012 and;


**WHEREAS**, without the tax revenues of the Food and Beverage Tax, Nashville will be unable to continue providing those services funded by the current tax:






